At the Finger Lakes International Wine Competition, Stempede and Miss Pissy Pants won double gold and Black Raspberry, Trimist and A Grand Sonny Day won gold. Buddy Boy's Chardonnay took the gold and best in show at the Riverside International Wine Competition. Darkside won the Keystone Cup Best Dry in the competition. At the PWA Wine Competition, Buddy Boy's Niagara won Best Sweet Wine and a gold medal.
